Diamond State Fibre Company Question (D108)

Diamond State Fibre Company has been listed in the *U.S. Perfins Catalog* as located in Bridgeport, CT for over 70 years. Unfortunately, we do not have documentation of that location in our archives. Please understand that in the 1940s and 1950s, before computers and the internet, work in our catalogs was tediously done by typewriters, and images of covers were not recorded.

So, imagine my surprise when the cover shown nearby recently appeared at auction. Clearly, the town is Bridgeport, PA not CT. And there is a new last known usage. So, which town is the correct primary town? We don't know for certain, but the PA location now appears to be the primary location.

An internet search shows that Diamond State Fibre Company had operations in both towns. Bridgeport, PA is less than 50 miles from Delaware and we note, perhaps just coincidentally, that one of the Delaware State nicknames is the "Diamond State". The references to company operations in CT appear to be minor compared to the large facility in PA.

Shown nearby is an aerial view of the Diamond State Fibre Company industrial facility on the banks of the Schuylkill River just south of DeKalb Pike in Bridgeport, Pennsylvania. An article on the internet tells us that the "facility contained the company's main offices and a fiber processing mill and factory." Views show the facility and the adjacent railroad tracks that serviced it.



Given the documented Bridgeport PA cover, we are inclined to change the primary State for perfin D108 to PA and to list the Bridgeport, CT location as a supplemental operation.

As an aside, there are 29 town in the United States named Bridgeport (AL, AZ, CA, CO, CT, FL, GA, IL, IN, IA, KS, KY, MD, MI, MS, MO, NE, NJ, NY, OH, OK, OR, PA, TN, TX, VA, WA, WV and WI). Precancels were used in 14 of those towns (AL, CT, IL, IN, KS, MI, NE, OH, PA, TX, WA, WV and WI), one of which saw preper use (Bridgeport, CT).

Please check your perfin, precancel and preper collections for information about D108 in Bridgeport CT and in Bridgeport PA.

Additions and Corrections (A&C#1a) for the *U.S. Perfins Catalog*

Steve Endicott (LM# 2284)

I have received, studied, and recorded updates to the *U.S. Perfins Catalog* from 22 members. Thank You! The *Catalog* is a living document, growing and improving with your contributions.

The updates range from (1) a few new user identifications and a few minor corrections to (2) numerous stamp usage period and postmark updates. Specifically, there are 81 specific updates of type 1 and 257 updates of type 2. How to most efficiently publish this information?

I have decided to print updates of type 1 once a year in the *Bulletin*, and post updates of type 2 on the Club's website. Updates of type 2 can be downloaded, or a member can request a printed copy from Steve Sherman, our Publication Sales Manager. Then, after 4 or 5 years, depending on the volume of changes, a complete A&C set will be published and will be available on the Club's website.

Below are the type 1 updates recorded in 2021

A&C Key: A = Addition; C = Correction; D = Deletion; N = New pattern; R = Replacement.

Note: where 'eCatalog' or 'eCat' are used below they refer to the spreadsheet version of the *Catalog* unless modified by the antecedent "PDF". **Also**, all A&C items listed here refer to all three delivery platforms (print, eCatalog and PDFCatalog) unless otherwise stipulated.

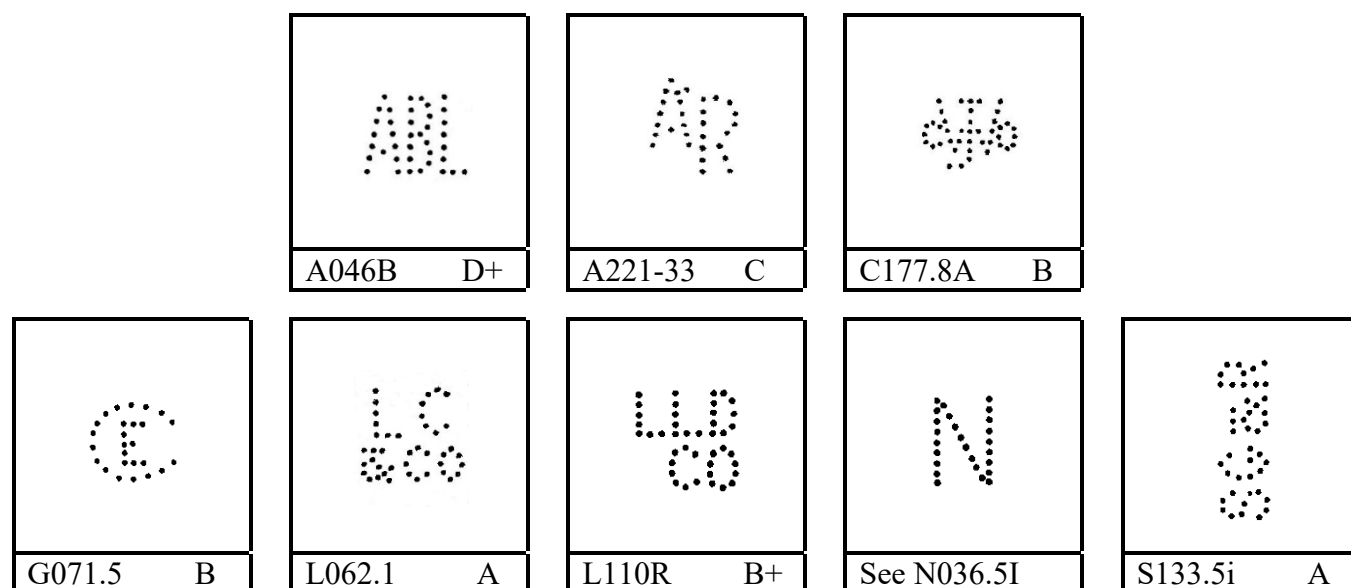

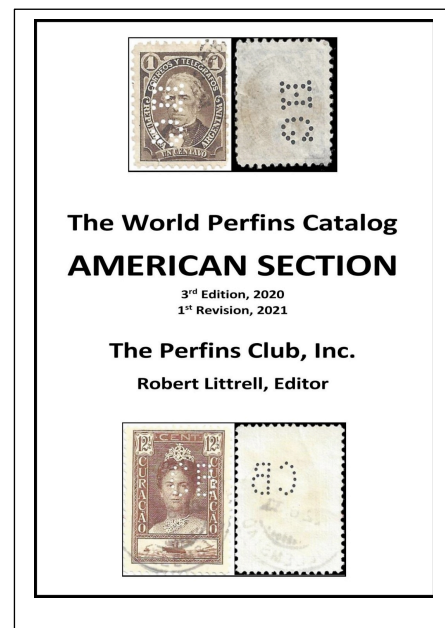
New Revision of the World Perfin Catalog – American Section

It Makes No Cents

Stephen Tauber (#2949)

While recently sorting through a group of stamps perfin'd with patterns beginning with 'R', I came upon one with the pattern R047. This is identified in the 2021 edition of the catalogue of U.S. patterns as Rd¢/Co. used by Reading Company (Railroad) with General Offices in

Philadelphia, PA. In isolation the third character in the pattern would reasonably be interpreted as '¢'. In context, however, this character must be read as a lower-case g plus a period: **Rdg./Co.** — as a straight-forward abbreviation of **Reading Company**

A New Preper Discovered

Paul Mistretta (LM111) edited from a brief note from Dave Smith (LM# 1514)

I early June of 2021 I received a brief note from Steve Endicott (actually a cc of a response to Dave Smith which included Dave's original note). Dave's note read: "Have had fun going through a preper collection I purchased last month. One find surprised me as I did not see it when looking through the collection for the first time - a beautiful Indianapolis No 1 on a 9 cent 1922 - a new denom, and I believe only the second copy known of this preper."

Attached to the note (and reproduced below) were scans, front and back, of the item mentioned.



Steve's response: "Yes, there are now two known; the other (which was the discovery copy) is on a 1c coil."

My curiosity was aroused, primarily due to the rarity of the item. The perfin, as noted in the email, is Design No. 1. The identified user of this pattern was the First National Bank of Chicago in Indianapolis, Indiana, presumably a branch office of the parent bank. Period of use for this pattern is listed as 1908-1922. And a note in the *Catalog of US Perfins* states that: "This pattern might have been produced by a Cummins modifiable perforator, specifically a Chicago check cancel device first patented on August 20, 1899."

According to the 2019 Precancel Stamp Society; *Town and Type Catalog* the precancel is a Type L-3E produced from one of two or more similar devices used at the Indianapolis Post Office.

For those unfamiliar with precancels, the PSS catalog number noted carries significant information. First, the "L" means that the device was produced locally for use in precancelling comparatively smaller orders; they were not produced by the Bureau of Printing and Engraving in Washington, DC which required a minimum

precancel run of 250,000 coil precancels or 500,000 sheet precancels be produced. The second bit of information carried in the catalog number is that the precancel impression was made by an "electroplate" device. This is a type of device, generally of 100 subjects, designed to press-apply precancels to 100 stamp regular series sized stamps at a time.

Unlike the B+ rating for the perfin the L-3E precancel carries a \$0.15 price tag indicating that it is an extremely common precancel.

The combination (preper) is unpriced in Smith's *Catalog of Perfined Precancels*. However, it carries a rarity factor of V on a scale of Z (common) to V (rare) which means that 10 or fewer are known. This rating is not surprising since when the preper catalog was released in 2018 the listing was based on a unique item.

Since the listing in Smith (2020) is for a perfin in a 1923 1¢ coil this new find represents an altogether beautiful and unique perfin x precancel combination.

After his republication review, Dave added the following: "One additional note related to the mention of the large volume requirement for ordering bureau precancels. The government did not issue a 100 subject PSS 200 series device unless the town expected to be precanceling at least 10,000 stamps at a time. Many towns ignored that and ordered the government device anyway. The locally made device got around that requirement. I suspect Indianapolis regularly precanceled at least 5,000 stamps at a time."

John Randall –1936 to 2021

Steve Endicott (LM# 2284)

John Randall closed his numerous stamp albums on October 19, 2021. He was the patriarch of our hobby, especially in perfins and prepers, for six decades. John was the editor of the *1998 Catalog of U.S. Perfins* (7 years in development) for which he received the Hallock Card award in 1999. He was also the editor (or co-editor) and the publisher for the *Catalog of Precancelled Envelopes* in 1976 and for the *Catalog of Perfinned Precancels of the United States* (prepers) both in 1991 and in 2009. He developed the first edition of the *International Precancel Catalog* in 2005. He was a significant contributor during the development of the 2018 edition of the *Catalog of U.S. Perfins*, the 2020 edition of the *Catalog of U.S. Perfinned Precancels*, and the *Silent Precancels Catalog*.



John served as U.S. Perfins Catalog chair for 9 years, as Foreign Perfins Catalog chair for 16 years, and as Club Vice President for 3 years. In August 2016, he received a special award and plaque recognizing his many years of philatelic research and catalog work, in addition to having attended 50 consecutive years of precancel/perfin national conventions – a remarkable accomplishment.

Introduced to precancels and perfins in 1960 while studying for his PhD in Chemical Engineering at the University of Wisconsin, he joined the Precancel Stamp Society in June 1961 and the Perfins Club in June 1975. John was fascinated by the convergence of perfins and precancels in United States postage, becoming an expert in this field. He often told us that the multi-five-dimensional aspects of prepers kept one's mind sharp (precancel State and Town, followed by perfin, then precancel style, then U.S. stamp issue and finally the stamp denomination). A collector needed to be knowledgeable in all these dimensions – and he certainly was!

John was predeceased by his wife of over 50 years, Virginia “Virge”, who attended every national convention with him and assisted him with his catalog publications, and his brother Bob. John is survived by his nephew Andy and his niece Allison, who both helped him immensely, especially after Virge passed. He is also survived by many nephews and nieces living in the Bay Area and in the Philippines, whom he regularly assisted.

John was the titan of perfin, precancel, and preper collecting, and a mental storehouse of knowledge of the finer points of collecting perfins and prepers. He will be remembered and very much missed.

Reinstate L110 (LLD/CO) as L110R

Steve Endicott (LM#2284)

Pattern [LLD/JCO] was found in early 2000 as was believed to be the complete pattern of L110, which has no indication of the letter J. Therefore, [LLD/JCO] was added to the US Perfins Catalog as perfin L109.5 and L110 was deleted as a partial pattern. Only one copy of L109.5 is known.

Thirteen copies of L110 (without the letter J) were reported in the 2006 AB+ survey. I have personally seen 10 of them. None of them shows any evidence of the letter J by a chad or dimple. All ten copies are in the 1917 2c Washington/Franklin stamp, perf 11. Illustrations are shown below. L109.5 is in the same 1917 2c stamp.



I have now seen two additional copies not reported earlier, both with the letter J. One is in Scott 540, type III, perf 11x10 issued in 1919. The other is in the 1923 perf 11 Blank Harding, shown nearby.

It is now clear that the original device included the letter J, was used for a very short time, after which the letter J was completely removed. The resultant device was used for almost a decade.

Pattern [LLD/JCO] will remain in the Catalog as L109.5, rated A. Pattern [LLD/CO] will be reinstated into the Catalog as L110R, rated B+. The stamp usage periods will be revised for both perfins to reflect our current understanding of their use.

Please check your collections and let me know of any additional copies you have of either perfin. And it would be wonderful to find a cover so that we could learn about the user.
